careful look how which path you go down to get the best deal for your summer golf.

The 10 percent card is also being offered meaning you now have more opportunities to save money.

It's criminal to give the city full price to play. I strongly urge everyone to take a couple minutes to find a plan – multi-pass or the discount card – and pick one up this spring. The money you save can always be re-invested in beer after your round...

On another positive note, on March 23, the city is bringing in their forestry folks to discuss the possibility of trimming trees at certain locations. It only took 10 years of raising the issue.

The exec has identified five high priority areas as a start point for discussions - they are holes, 1, 3, 4, 5, and 18.

I've talked to the senior silviculture and science guys in my department. There's absolutely no harm to the tree from trimming the branches up three feet.

I fully expect some bovine scat song and dance, but if, at the least, I can get them to admit there's no harm in doing the work then all we have to do is lean on them to shake free the funds to get the work done.

I'll have more to say on this at the meet and greet on April 26. Even if we're successful – and I truly hope we are – it's likely the city won't get to it until fall after the trees set up for winter.

The Away Tournament this year is set for Wolf Creek (East and West courses) Saturday June 24, 2017, start time is 0740 hours. Stan Mah has worked a deal with a hotel in Lacombe (I think) it's close anyway for those that might want to go down Friday night.

There are also some RV sites available onsite for those who want to take a camper down or tent for the weekend. I'm packing a tent - and praying for blue skies - good times.

Those camping or in the hotel will have the first tee times – and may want to make a weekend of it and play 36.

But it's hard to be Club Captain and Club Champion at the same time, especially during the Champions Cup at the end of the season. I am hoping that Steve will stay on as assistant Club Captain to help me through the transition and make sure I don't mess up.

As Club Captain I am responsible for running our interclub which I'm super excited about! I believe that we have a great group of guys in our club and that we will be much stronger and more competitive this year with our team!

I have been talking with the boys on the executive and we are going to be getting the company that makes the Vic shirts to put interclub logos on the shirts this year!

We have also discussed the possibility of team jackets which I hope you boys would like to have and act as an incentive to play some good competitive golf early in the season to make the team.

For the new guys joining our club this year interclub works like this; our main job is managing the Interclub team. Men's Interclub is a match-play format competition between twelve-man teams from Edmonton and area course. Our Interclub

team will be comprised of five guaranteed spots and seven qualifier spots:

- Club Champion;
- Head Pro;
- Club Captain;
- 2x Captain's Picks; and
- Seven Qualifiers.

The top seven golfers in the combined low gross score qualifying rounds will become those seven qualifiers. As was introduced a couple of years ago, your best

two-out-of-three rounds count towards your qualifying score. The dates for qualifying are listed in the tournament schedule in the newsletter.

If you don't make it onto the twelve-man team, there is still a chance for you to play. If you play at least two of the three qualifying rounds, you will be considered as an alternate. Alternates will fill in for those on the team who may not be able to play a specific match.

Times and dates for all interclub matches are determined by the Edmonton Golf Association (EGA).

Ok that's all for me, I am not a writer, I am a beer drinking golfer that is looking forward to seeing all of you this golf season. Here's to another great season.
